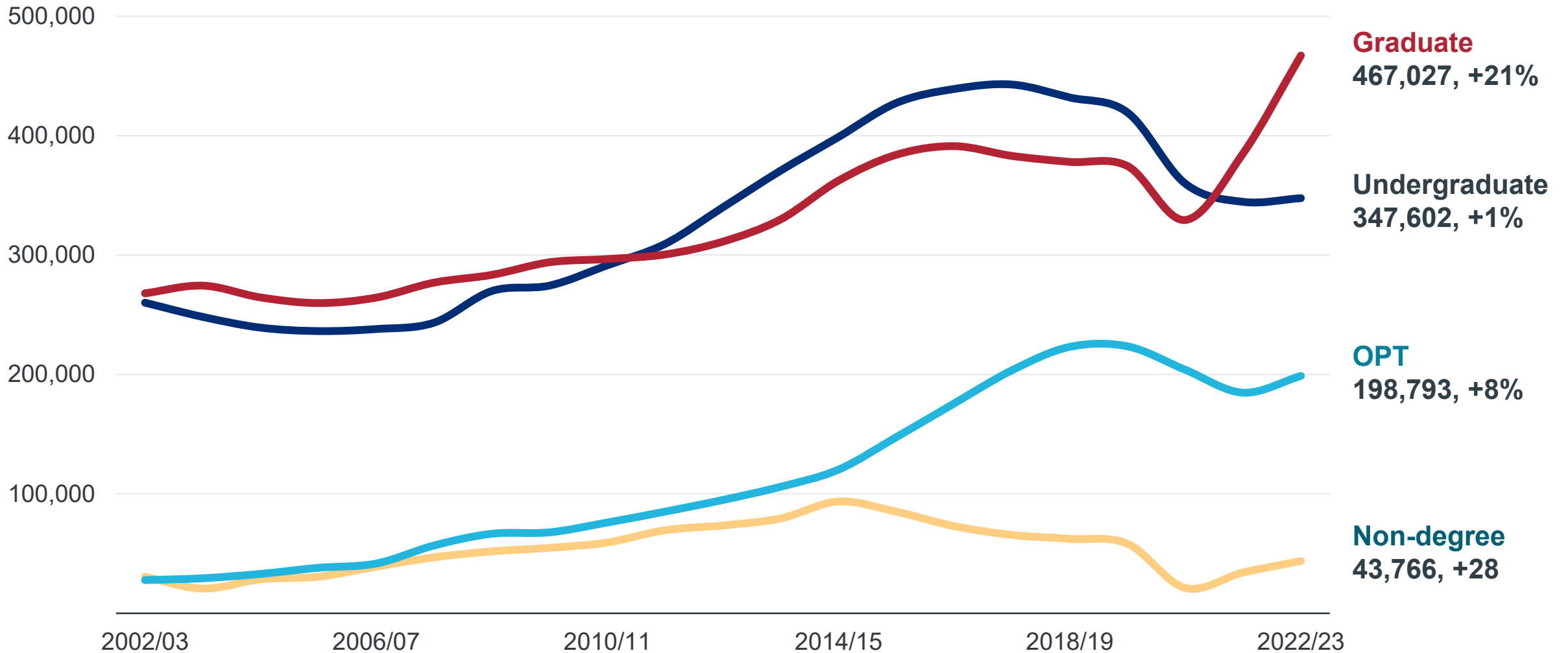

International Students by Academic Level

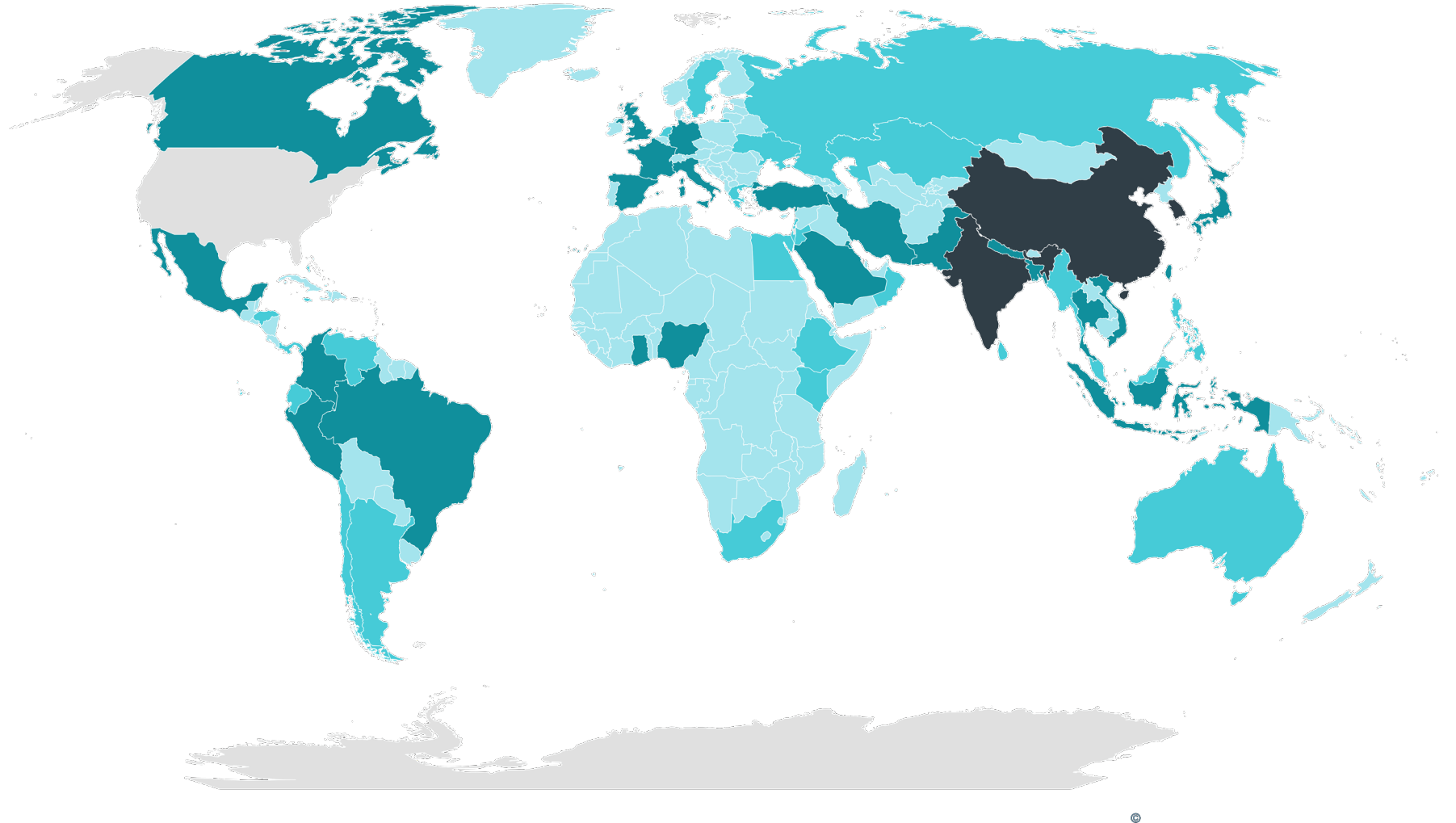




International Students by Place of Origin

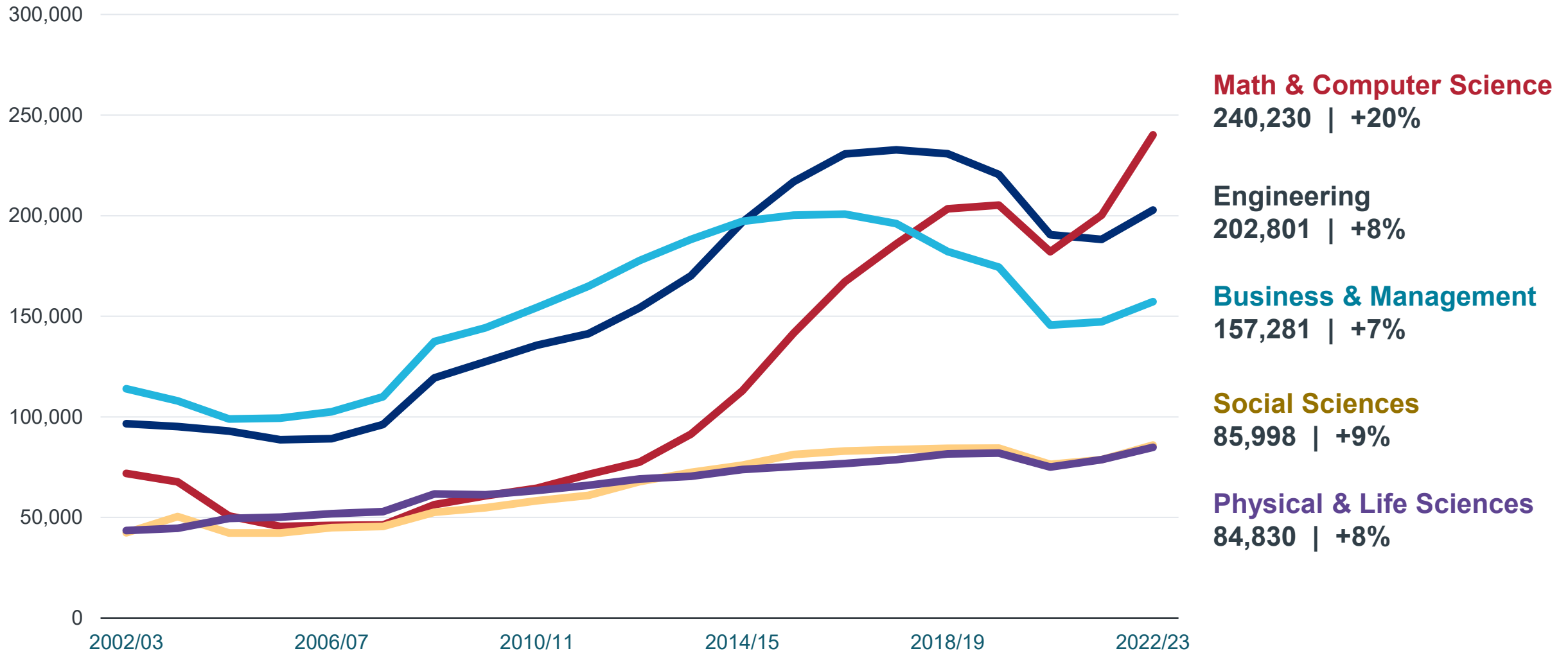
Top Places of Origin

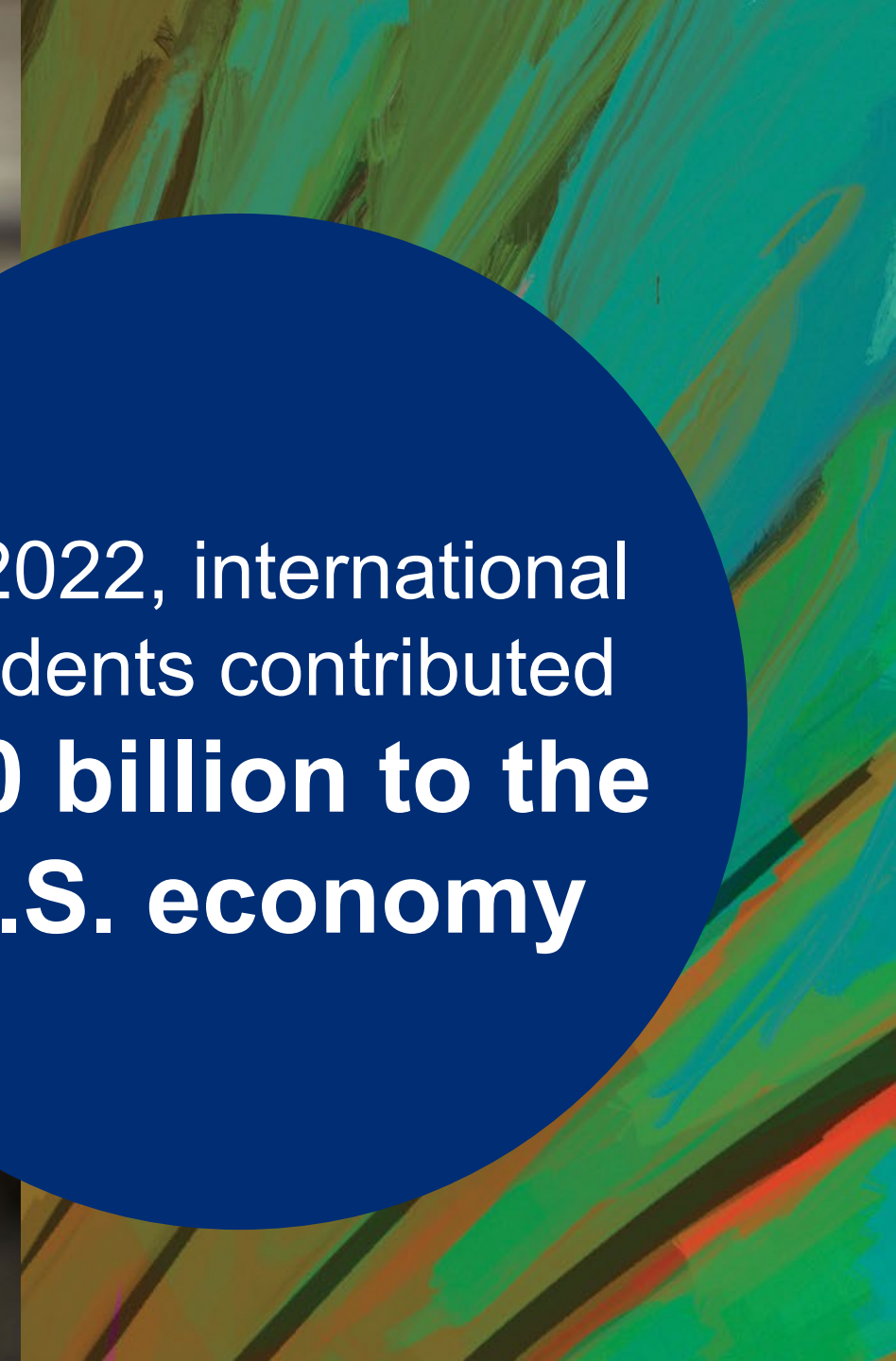


International Students by Field of Study





In 2022, international students contributed **\$40 billion to the U.S. economy**

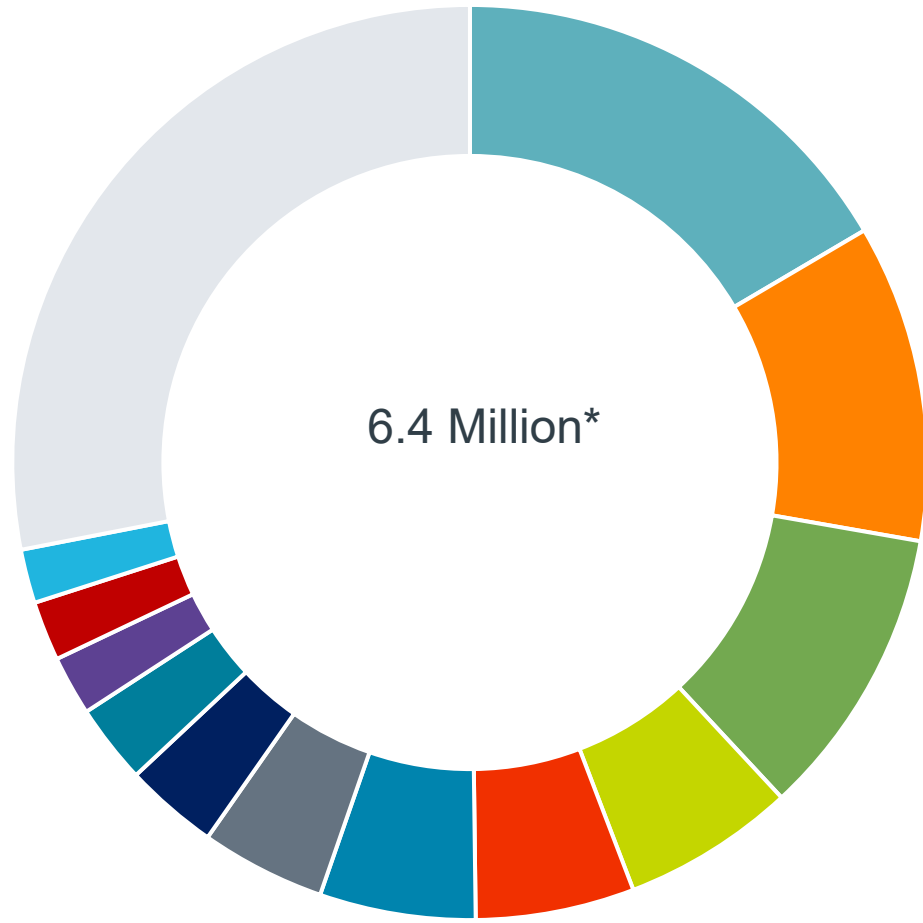

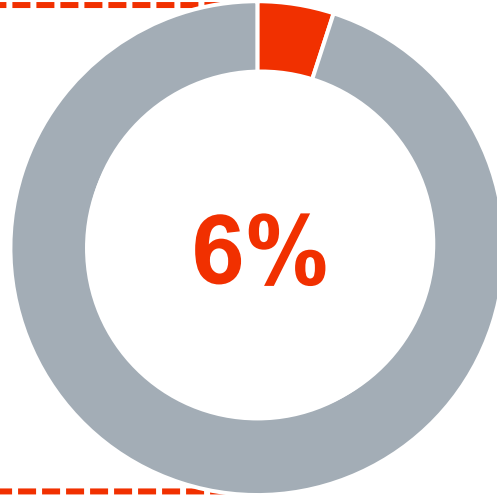


International Students: Proportion of Total Enrollment

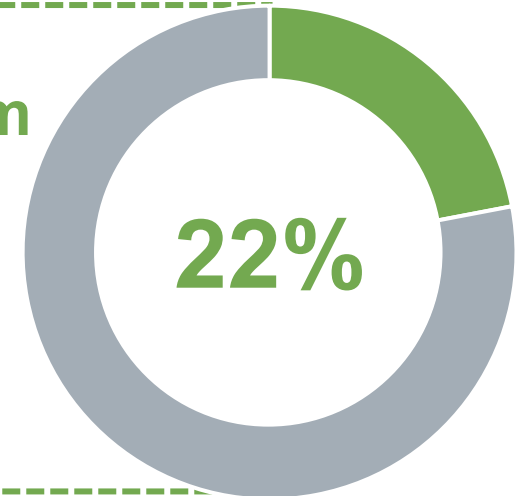

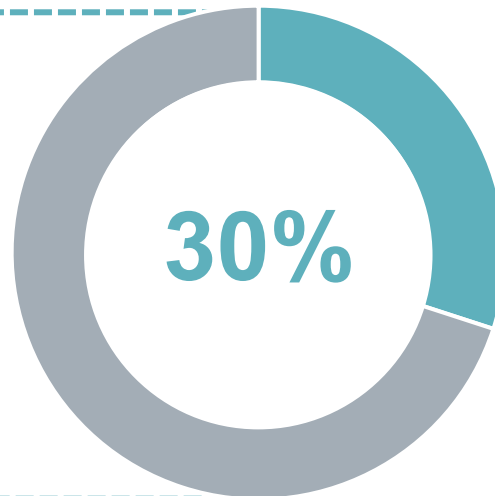

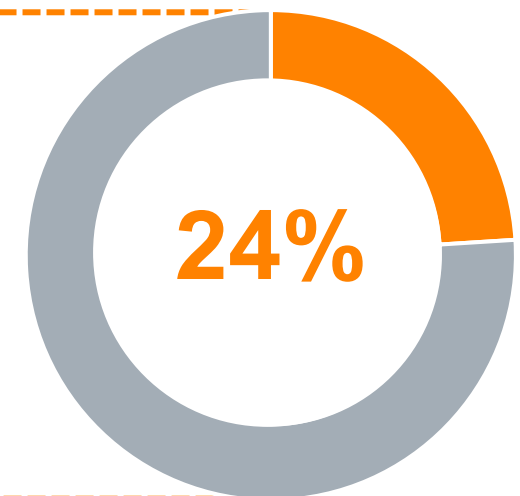

U.S. Interest in International Students



92% of institutions noted interest in increasing enrollment **over the next 5 years.**

By 2030...

Universities hosting 8,000 or more international students

- Could increase enrollments by 20%

Universities hosting 1,000 – 7,999 international students

- Could double the total number of international students

Universities with less than 1,000 international students

- Could triple the total number of international students
